Last Month's Lodge of Instruction (LOI) highlighted the comparisons between Marshall Arts & Freemasonry

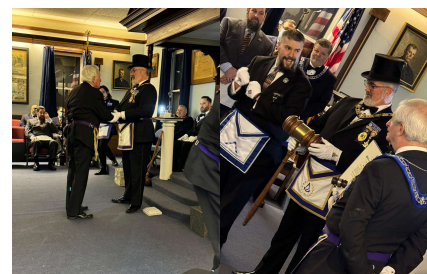

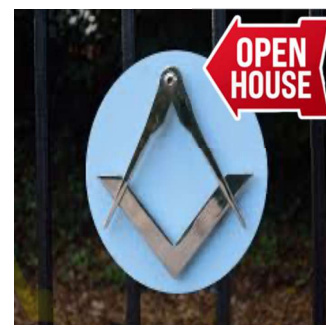
